Congratulations!

To Senior All-America Players:

On behalf of Corrigan Sports, I am pleased to congratulate you for being selected to participate in the 2023 All-America Lacrosse Game. You are now one of the most visible athletes in lacrosse. With almost two decades of tradition, the All-America weekend promises to be a truly memorable experience. This information packet provides an outline of activities and responsibilities concerning your participation in this event.

The Senior All-America games will be played on Saturday, July 29 at historic Homewood Field on the campus of Johns Hopkins University (Baltimore, MD). The Senior Girls will play at 5:30 pm followed by the Senior Boys at 8:00 pm. Both games will be televised live on ESPNU. This is your opportunity to perform in front of the entire lacrosse community, including a national television audience.

Travel Planning

Each player is responsible for arranging their own travel to and from Baltimore for the event. Please plan to arrive in Baltimore no later than Friday, July 28 and check-in at the headquarters hotel (Royal Sonesta Harbor Court) between 9:00 am-12:00 pm. Please make your travel plans as soon as possible to insure a timely arrival.

Players will be provided a complimentary room at the headquarters hotel for the duration of the event. Each player is required to stay at the hotel and will be assigned another player as a roommate. A dedicated room block is also available for families at the same hotel. Parents, and other family members, are responsible for their own travel and hotel expenses. Details can be found on the Travel Information page (Section No. 4).

Health Protocols

While we recognize that public health conditions have improved significantly over the past year, the management of live events requires us to establish precautions that will keep all participants safe. We ask participating athletes to monitor their health. If you experience any cold or flu-like symptoms prior to the All-America event, please seek medical attention and notify us. This event will adhere to applicable federal, state and local public health guidelines and mandates.

All event staff and participants are encouraged to practice good personal health habits each day. This includes attention to personal hygiene, social distancing as appropriate and limiting time in enclosed areas.

Event Schedule

A preliminary event schedule can be found in Section No. 3 of this packet. Players *MUST* attend all activities as scheduled. Once each player checks in with the event organizer at the hotel, all overnight accommodations, meals and transportation will be provided with one exception. The lone exception is attendance at the Welcome Dinner on Friday, July 28. Each participating player must purchase a ticket in advance to attend the dinner.

IMMEDIATE ITEMS TO DO:

- ✓ Each player must complete a brief survey indicating their preferred sizes for apparel and footwear, preferred game jersey and shipping address. The survey link is provided in Section No. 2.
- ✓ A Registration Link is provided in Section No. 6. Each player must log-in and register for the Senior All-America Game. Your biographical information and photo will be used for the event website and souvenir game program. Please complete the registration process as soon as possible.
- ✓ If you sustain an injury or illness that prevents you from participating in the event, please notify us immediately.

Custom All-America Sticks

Each field player will receive a custom All-America head and handle courtesy of ECD Lacrosse. Prior to the event each Boys field player will receive a package with a positional head and mesh kit. For the Girls, each field player will receive a complete stick. All goalies will receive a custom positional head and mesh kit. This will provide an opportunity to properly break-in sticks before use in the All-America Game.

Packages will be sent to your home address directly from ECD Lacrosse. The packages are scheduled to ship the week of June 26. Players should make arrangements to have their positional head strung in advance and bring with them to Baltimore. Handles will be provided at event check-in and those sticks must be used in the All-America Game.

Each participating All-America player is responsible for making their own travel arrangements. 

- ✓ The file should be a high-resolution image (300 dpi or higher).
- ✓ High School senior portrait in gown or uniform work best.
- ✓ Ideally, the background is primarily one solid color.
- ✓ Do not submit an image that is cropped from a group photo. The player profiled must be the only person in the photo.
- ✓ When uploading files please label/save as 'LastName_FirstName.jpg' [Example: Smith_John.jpg]

Photos and biographical information must be uploaded by **June 30**. You will have the chance to update your stats/accolades at anytime on the registration page until **July 5** (this is the deadline for information to be included in the game program).

Participation Agreement

Your selection as a Senior All-American means that you are participating in this event as an invited guest. This invitation is a privilege, not a right.

Each athlete will be asked to sign a Participant Agreement upon check-in at the headquarters hotel on July 28. This Agreement will be reviewed with all athletes and the continued participation of each player will be contingent upon meeting these expectations for behavior.

We remind each participant to exercise good judgment and conduct themselves with honesty, integrity and respect for others at all times. Each Senior All-America player is expected to agree to the following Code of Conduct for the duration of the event:

- **BE RESPECTFUL:** I WILL treat others as I would ask them to treat me.
- **BE ON TIME:** I WILL be prepared for each activity as listed in the event schedule or as directed by the Corrigan Sports staff and its event partners.
- ALCOHOL AND DRUG USE: I WILL NOT consume alcoholic beverages during this event. I
 WILL NOT use or distribute any illegal substances of any kind during this event.
- VIOLENCE: I WILL NOT engage in, and WILL NOT tolerate, any violent acts, including assaults
 on person or property, hate crimes, stalking, non-consensual sexual contact or any other conduct
 prohibited by law.
- SOCIAL MEDIA RESPONSIBILITY: I WILL NOT author, forward or post vulgar or offensive notes, texts, photos or other content that reflects negatively on this event or its participants.
- **PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY:** I WILL be responsible for my own behavior and will abide by the guidelines for participation in the Senior All-America event.
- **CONSEQUENCES:** I acknowledge that Corrigan Sports, as the organizer of the Senior All-America event, has the authority to revoke my participation in this event including removal from the Senior game, reclaiming all equipment, apparel and footwear distributed, removal from the hotel as well as denial of any travel stipend or other expense reimbursements. The event organizer also has the right to contact my parents/guardians and future college coaches to communicate any issues or problems with my behavior.

Remember that you will also be representing your family, your future college program and the sport of lacrosse at this event. Please do not take this responsibility lightly.
